



CWCI Case Law Seminar XXII – 2020 Update

Background: The California workers' compensation system is being constantly reshaped and redefined by case law, which has become a critical element in defining how the system operates. The growing volume of published appellate case law and even board panel decisions, combined with the increased complexity of the issues, have made it difficult for workers' compensation professionals to keep up with all the changes and devise appropriate strategies, defenses, and responses. The 2020 program represents the 22nd installment in the CWCI case law seminar series, and is designed for attorneys, claims personnel, hearing reps, and others who are responsible for administering and defending for workers' compensation claims.
