

CWCI Case Law Seminar – 2018 Update

Background: Many of the workers' compensation legislative reforms and regulations adopted by the state in recent years have raised issues, questions, and disputes that the courts have been asked to resolve. As a result, the California workers' compensation system continues to be reshaped and redefined by case law, which has become a critical element in defining how the system operates.

The growing volume of case law and the increased complexity of the issues have made it difficult for workers' compensation professionals to keep up with all the changes and devise appropriate strategies, defenses, and responses. The 2018 program represents the 20th installment in the CWCI case law seminar series, designed for attorneys, claims personnel, hearing reps, and others who are responsible for administering and defending claims.

This full-day seminar, presented by a panel of workers' compensation experts from both Northern and Southern California, will provide an update on recent trends in decisional law, and examine the practical impact that recent rulings and judicial interpretations of various courts have on benefit delivery and claim adjudication.

NEW THIS YEAR: We are delighted to welcome veteran defense attorney Elizabeth Hudson as a member of our educational panel. The panelists will ensure that you will have a better understanding of how to use case law to effectively manage, negotiate, and defend claims.

The panelists will present alternate viewpoints on case law that will help those handling work injury cases develop appropriate responses and policies. You will have the opportunity to ask questions during the presentation. A popular addition to last year's session, we will again provide a full audiovisual presentation, allowing you to learn important case details, factual backgrounds, and other highlights for every case on the agenda. Your course materials will also include hyperlinks to many of the actual case decisions.

Seminar Format: The Institute will conduct the seminar at two locations: Monday, May 14 at the Hotel Nikko San Francisco and Wednesday, May 16 at the Grand Long Beach Event Center. The program (including speaker presentations and Q&A opportunity) will run from 9 a.m. until 3:30

p.m., with a 1-hour lunch at noon, plus midmorning and mid-afternoon refreshment / email breaks. **NEW THIS YEAR:** You may choose from a selection of lunch entrées.

Participants: This seminar is appropriate for attorneys, claims administrators, hearing reps, and others with negotiating authority.
