

Background: The California workers' compensation system is being constantly reshaped and redefined by case law, which has become a critical element in defining how the system operates. Many of the workers' compensation legislative reforms and regulations adopted by the state in recent years have raised issues, questions, and disputes that the courts have been asked to resolve. The growing volume of published appellate case law and even board panel decisions, combined with the increased complexity of the issues, have made it difficult for workers' compensation professionals to keep up with all the changes and devise appropriate strategies, defenses, and responses. The 2019 program represents the 21st installment in the CWCI case law seminar series, and is designed for attorneys, claims personnel, hearing reps, and others who are responsible for administering and defending for workers' compensation claims.

This full-day seminar, presented by a panel of workers' compensation experts from both Northern and Southern California, will provide an update on recent trends in decisional law, and examine the practical impact that new case law will have on benefit delivery and claim adjudication. **NEW THIS YEAR:** We are happy to welcome back defense attorneys Saul Allweiss and Jake Jacobsmeyer to our educational panel; meanwhile, Elizabeth Hudson (who debuted last year) is now acting as counsel on behalf of injured workers and will provide real-world practical insight from an applicant's attorney perspective.
